On this day the service begins in silence.

All then kneel for silent prayer, after which the Celebrant stands and begins the liturgy with the Collect of the Day in the Book of Common Prayer (BCP) on page 276.

Celebrant Blessed be our God.

People For ever and ever. Amen.

Let us pray.

Almighty God, we pray you graciously to behold this your family, for whom our Lord Jesus Christ was willing to be betrayed, and given into the hands of sinners, and to suffer death upon the cross; who now lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen**.

The people may be seated.

Psalm 22: 1-11 Deus, Deus meus

My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? *

and are so far from my cry

and from the words of my distress?

O my God, I cry in the daytime, but you do not answer; *

Yet you are the Holy One, *

enthroned upon the praises of Israel.

Our forefathers put their trust in you; *

they trusted, and you delivered them.

They cried out to you and were delivered; *

they trusted in you and were not put to shame.

Give mercy and grace to the living; pardon and rest to the dead; to your holy Church peace and concord; and to us sinners everlasting life and glory; for with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, one God, now and forever. **Amen**.

The service ends in silent prayer. The people are invited to come kneel or stand at the cross for silent prayer. If you brought your prayer rock, engraved with our Lord's cross which was given to you on Ash Wednesday, you may leave it at the foot of the cross. The words of this anthem may also be said quietly.

We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world. If we have died with him, we shall also live with him; if we endure, we shall also reign with him.
